# General Presentment and Reports Athens-Clarke County Grand Jury April 2025 Term

On April 14, 2025, twenty-five jurors, including two alternates, were selected to serve as members of the Grand Jury for the April 2025 term of the Athens-Clarke County Superior Court. The Honorable Judge Patrick Haggard administered the oath of service and formally charged the jurors with their responsibilities.

# **I. Criminal Functions**

During the April 2025 term, the Grand Jury reviewed 195 cases for indictment. The outcomes were as follows:

- True Bills Returned: 192
- Split Bills Returned: 3
- No Bills Returned: 0

# ADDENDUM A

# **Clarke County Jail Inspection Report**

#### Grand Jury – April 2025 Term

## I. Purpose of Inspection

The purpose of the Clarke County Jail inspection was to ensure that the facility is operating in compliance with expected standards regarding cleanliness, inmate welfare, staffing, and service delivery.

# II. Date of Visit

The inspection was conducted on May 13, 2025.

# **III. Participants**

The following Grand Jury members participated in the inspection:

- Calethia Daniel
- Sziluia Somooi
- Jennifer Padgett
- Matthew Reiter
- Jill Crandall
- Gerneatha Daniel
- Haley Cullum

Jail administration and representatives from the Clarke County Sheriff's Office assisted and guided the tour.

#### **IV. Findings and Observations**

• The facility was notably clean and well-maintained throughout the areas observed.

• The jail provides a variety of programs aimed at preparing inmates with valuable life and employment skills for successful reintegration into the community after release.

• The facility is currently understaffed, which was evident during the tour.

• Jail administration reported that staffing shortages are largely due to a pay disparity between Sheriff's deputies and city police officers.

• Food quality appeared substandard. We were informed that the current budget allocates just over \$2 per inmate per day, limiting food quality and preparation resources.

# V. Recommendations

The Grand Jury respectfully makes the following recommendations:

1. Review and adjust the budget to support increased compensation for Sheriff's deputies.

2. Increase funding for food services, including meal ingredients and kitchen equipment.

3. Provide additional resources to ensure inmates receive three meals per day on holidays and during non-traditional mealtimes.

#### VI. Conclusion

Overall, the Clarke County Jail meets standards in areas such as cleanliness and the availability of rehabilitative programs. However, the Grand Jury has serious concerns regarding staffing shortages and food service quality. We encourage the appropriate governing bodies to address these concerns to ensure the safety, well-being, and dignity of both inmates and staff.
